Attendance for people with a new diagnosis of diabetes is low across England and locally we are about the same with just 6% attending.

Good control of BP, cholesterol and HbA1c (sugar) is important. However, only 7 out of 20 people with diabetes have good control of all three. We need to make improvements

Diagnosing cancer at an early stage is important however only 1/2 of all cancer cases are diagnosed early, this result is about the same as across England however needs to improve

Almost 3 out of every 4 people with cancer survive beyond the first year. This result is higher than seen across England

Almost 3 out of 4 people estimated to have dementia in our population have been found, this result is amongst the best in England

4 out of every 5 people with a diagnosis have care planning and post-diagnostic support in place, again this is amongst the best in England

NHS Airedale, Wharfedale & Craven CCG – key points

Overall rating of **OUTSTANDING** for 2017/18 which was an improvement on 2016/17 with Better Health, and Leadership are rated as **GREEN** and Better Care and Sustainability rated **AMBER**. The Quality of Leadership (accounts for 25% of weighting) for Qtr2 is **GREEN STAR**, however in-year financial performance (accounts for 25% of the weighting) was rated **AMBER**.

- **National clinical priority ratings** published in August 2018 for cancer the rating dropped from outstanding to **good** and for Maternity the rating in 2017/18 was **good**. In January 2019 the clinical priority ratings for the remaining four areas were released with diabetes rating remaining at **requires improvement**, mental health improved from requires improvement to **good**, learning disabilities remained at **requires improvement** and dementia improved from good to **outstanding**.
- **Key NHS constitutional standards under pressure include:** for A&E 4hr waiting time standard, 18 week referral to treatment time, cancer 62 day referral to treatment time and IAPT coverage.
- **Areas performing well include:** AMR broad spectrum antibiotic prescribing, dementia diagnosis rate and post diagnostic support, delayed transfers of care, mental health out of area placements (MH), extended access in primary care and uptake of the e-referrals service has reached 70.5%.
- **Areas for improvement include:** Diabetes treatment levels and structured education for newly diagnosed patients (within 12 months), health inequalities admissions UCSCs and ACS, smoking at the time of delivery has increased further to 13.5%, learning disabilities annual health checks has improved from 43.4% to 46% although this result remains below the 65% target, CHC assessments taking place in hospital has risen to 19.8% above the 15% target and in-year financial performance for Qtr 2 2018/19 remains **AMBER** and demand management (NHS RightCare) has been rated **AMBER**. Partial compliance with probity and corporate governance – relates to minor recommendation around how procurement decisions are recorded on the conflicts of interest register.

Care planning

17 out of 20 people estimated to have dementia in our population have been found, this result is amongst the best in England

3 out of 4 people with a diagnosis have care planning and post-diagnostic support in place, this places us in Band 3 indicating we need to improve

NHS Bradford City CCG – key points

Overall rating of **OUTSTANDING** for 2017/18 an improvement on 2016/17, with Better Health and Better Care rated **RED** indicating areas with the greatest need for improvement, Sustainability rated **AMBER** and Leadership **GREEN**. The Quality of Leadership (accounts for 25% of weighting) was awarded a **GREEN STAR** and in-year financial performance (accounts for 25% of the weighting) was rated **GREEN** rating for Qtr2 of 2018/19.

- **National clinical priority ratings** published in August 2018 for cancer and maternity with both maintaining **requires improvement** ratings. In January 2019 the clinical priority ratings for the remaining four areas were released with diabetes rating remaining at **inadequate**, mental health remaining **requires improvement**, learning disabilities improved from requires improvement to **good** and dementia dropping from outstanding to **good**.
- **Key NHS constitutional standards under pressure include:** for A&E 4hr waiting time standard, IAPT coverage and recovery, 18 week referral to treatment time*, cancer 62 day referral to treatment time and diagnostic 6 weeks waiting time.
- **Areas performing well include:** admissions for falls injuries, early intervention psychosis, zero out of area placements (MH), learning disabilities physical health checks and completeness of registers, dementia diagnosis, delayed transfers of care, extended access in primary care has reached 100% coverage and uptake of the e-referrals service has reached 85.5% although the standard is now 100%.
- **Areas for improvement:** diabetes: structured education and treatment levels, health inequalities admissions ACS & UCSCs*, urgent care sensitive admissions* antimicrobial resistance prescribing in primary care, smoking at the time of delivery has increased again to 13.7%, 30% of CHC assessments are taking place in hospital double the 15% standard and demand management (NHS RightCare). Partial compliance with probity and corporate governance – relates to minor recommendation around how procurement decisions are recorded on the conflicts of interest register.

Just under 4 out of 5 people with a diagnosis have care planning and post-diagnostic support in place, this results is similar to the average across England

NHS Bradford Districts CCG – key points

Overall rating of **GOOD** for 2017/18 the same as previous years, with Better Health, Better Care and Sustainability are all rated as **AMBER** indicating a need for improvement and leadership is rated as **GREEN**. The Quality of Leadership (accounts for 25% of weighting) was awarded a **GREEN STAR** and in-year financial performance (accounts for 25% of the weighting) was rated **GREEN** rating for Qtr2 of 2018/19.

- **National clinical priority ratings** published in August 2018 for cancer dropping from good to **requires improvement** and maternity improving from inadequate to **requires improvement**. In January 2019 the clinical priority ratings for the remaining four areas were released with diabetes rating remaining at **requires improvement**, mental health remaining **good**, learning disabilities maintaining a **requires improvement** and dementia improving from good to **outstanding**.
- **Key NHS constitutional standards under pressure include:** for A&E 4hr waiting time standard, IAPT coverage and recovery rate, early intervention psychosis, 18 week referral to treatment time* and cancer 62 day referral to treatment time*.
- **Areas performing well include:** low number of bed days out of area (MH), learning disabilities physical health checks & GP register, dementia diagnosis and support, delayed transfers of care, extended access in primary care has reached 100% coverage and uptake of the e-referrals service has reached 85.0%, although the standard is now set at 100%.
- **Areas for improvement:** diabetes structured education for newly diagnosed patients, inequality chronic - ACS & UCSCs, emergency admissions for UCS, maternal smoking at delivery, 17.4% of CHC assessments taking place in an acute hospital setting which is just above the 15% standard, diagnostic 6 weeks waiting time and demand management (NHS RightCare). Partial compliance with probity and corporate governance – relates to minor recommendation around how procurement decisions are recorded on the conflicts of interest register.
